EARLY COLLEGE CHAMPION: The

MCHS Early College program functions as a "school within a school," challenging students from the academic middle. Rykiah takes pride in being a member of the Early College's inaugural class, and she helps recruit and mentor incoming freshmen. "I love the Early College program! If you need help, the teachers are all-hands-on-deck. I'm saving so much money on courses, and when I go to college, I'll be ahead of the curve."

CONNECTED 24/7: Rykiah uses a Chromebook as part of a 1:1 pilot program at MCHS. "We have some pencil-and-paper stuff in Early College, but mostly our teachers use Google Classroom for assignments. A lot of kids don't have computers at home, but they're a key to success. Having the Chromebook means I have my computer everywhere I go."

SECRET TO SUCCESS: "I think about my future all the time. If there's a big assignment due, I focus everything I have on it. All of this is going to pay off in the future."
