Update: Al's Supermarket Involving Kids

Here are some additional details from Al's, on activities they are sponsoring for students (both Franklin and Karwick) ...

1. Our **Earth Day** project is entitled "Repurposed for a Purpose." There are two age groups: 6-10 yr.olds and 11-15 yr. olds. We are asking that all students that would like to enter the contest bring their submission in no later than April 16, 2013. Should any of the teachers want to make this part of their class grade/curriculum we ask that they narrow the contestants to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place prior to entering them so we can get a handle on the number of submissions. Please remind them they will also need an 8 1/2 x 11 sign explaining what their project is and its final purpose. Again prizes will be based on customer votes, creativity and originality. All participants will receive a coupon for a free package of Wild Harvest Cookies. One winner from each age group will receive 4 Culinary Circle Pizzas, 4 2 liter bottles of Super Chill soda, 2 1/2 gallons of Stoneridge Ice Cream and of course, 1 pkg. of the Wild Harvest Cookies. Open voting will take place on April 20 and 21st. The winner will be announced on April 22 at 5 pm. We are asking that they pick up their projects by April 23.

- 2. In May we will be hosting a Mother's Day Essay Contest entitled "Why my Mom is so special "that will be open to all 4th-6th graders. We are not limiting this to just biological mothers. We are opening this up to any female caregiver. We ask that all submissions be handwritten. Each submission will need to have on it Mom's name, child's name and phone number.
