Substance Abuse Grant

Michigan City Area Schools is one of 12 public and private school corporations that have received funding from the Healthcare Foundation of LaPorte, through a new initiative called Partners in Prevention. Our district's \$12,000 planning grant is assisting us in the preparation of a competitive grant by May 6th that will center on providing our students with evidence-based substance abuse prevention programs. The Healthcare Foundation of La Porte plans to award up to \$2.8 million to La Porte County schools for planning and three years of implementation grants to reduce students' substance use through this initiative.

National Park Passes for 4th Graders

Every year, beginning September 1, all children in the fourth grade have access to their own Every Kid in a Park pass. This pass provides free access to national parks across the country.
