Lead Testing Pilot

Parent-Teacher conferences will be held on Wednesday, November 14th at all elementary buildings, from 3:15 to 7:15pm. At two buildings, Knapp and Marsh, we will be offering free lead testing for all kindergarteners. We have selected these schools as part of a pilot testing program due to their location in neighborhoods identified as high risk, mainly based on the age of homes and the possible presence of lead-based paint in those homes. Partners in this effort include the LaPorte County Health Department, HealthLinc, and the Mayor's Committee on Lead, which will be providing information for parents and has secured bikes as incentive prizes for testing, thanks to Partners for Clean Air and the Bike Stop.
