gives high school students a unique opportunity to jump-start their college education. Early College classes result in credits for both a **high school diploma** and for **college**, through Advanced Placement (AP) and dual credit.

All classes take place at Michigan City High School and are taught by highly qualified teachers who have developed coursework in conjunction with Purdue University Northwest and Ivy Tech.



The Early College program is limited to 125 students at each grade level (9-12) and functions as a "school within a school" with dedicated teachers to provide **personal attention** and prepare students for college courses. Students also receive **specialized guidance services**.

#### Michigan City's Early College

**program** gives both students in the academic "middle" and high achievers an important foundation, **preparing them for success** beyond high school — whether they plan to pursue college or a professional training/certification program.

Currently, **Michigan City Early College** students can earn an Academic or Technical Honors high school diploma, along with credits from Purdue University Northwest or Ivy Tech. These credits are transferrable to colleges and universities across the nation.

### What's Required?

Once a student is accepted into the **Early College program**, a guidance counselor will assist with course scheduling.

**Michigan City Early College students** will take all required courses for an Indiana Core 40 high school diploma. They also must take three years of a



Foreign Language. Dual-credit electives will allow students to earn college credits in a variety of disciplines.

All core subjects in the Early College program are Academic Honors classes. Due to the added rigor, 9th and 10th graders in Early College take a skills/resource class to provide added support and SAT prep. Students must maintain a G.P.A. of at least 2.0 to remain in the Early College program.

Early College students are required to take Physical Education and Health/ Wellness during **Summer School** or must earn P.E. credits through participation in Athletics or Marching Band. See your counselor for information.



Students will be able to participate in all **extra-curric-ular activities** offered at Michigan City High School.
