## **Michigan City Early College**



gives high school students a unique opportunity to jump-start their college education. Early College classes result in credits for both a high school diploma and for college, through Advanced Placement (AP) and dual credit.

All classes take place at Michigan City High School and are taught by highly qualified teachers who have developed coursework in conjunction with Ivy Tech and Indiana University.



The Early College program

is limited to 100 students at each grade level (9-12) and functions as a "school within a school" with dedicated teachers to provide personal attention and prepare students for college courses. Students also receive specialized guidance services. They take part in college visits, special recognition ceremonies, and even have an Early College Club.

Michigan City's Early College **program** gives both students in the academic "middle" and high achievers an important foundation, preparing them for success beyond high school — whether they plan to pursue college or a professional training/certification program.

Graduates of our program have received full or partial scholarships to attend Indiana, Purdue, Valparaiso and many other universities. Others attend trade schools or have enlisted in the U.S. military. We are grateful to partners such as Horizon Bank, which provides a Early College

financial literacy program, and the Urban League of NWI, which asssists with college and career planning.

Currently, Michigan City Early College students can earn

an Academic or Technical Honors high school diploma, along with credits from Ivy Tech or Indiana University. These credits transfer to colleges and universities across the nation.



#### What's Required?

Once a student is accepted into the Early College program, a school counselor will assist with course scheduling.

Michigan City Early College students will take all required courses for an Indiana Core 40 high school diploma. They also must take three years of a Foreign Language. Dual-credit electives allow students to take a variety of additional classes.

All core subjects in the Early College program are Academic Honors classes. Due to the added rigor, 9th and 10th graders in Early College take a skills/resource class to provide added support and SAT prep. Students must maintain a G.P.A. of at least



2.0 to remain in the Early College program.

Early College students are encouraged to take Physical Education and Health/Wellness during **Summer School** or must earn P.E. credits through participation in Athletics or Marching Band. See your counselor for information.

Students will be able to participate in all extracurricular activities at Michigan City High School.
