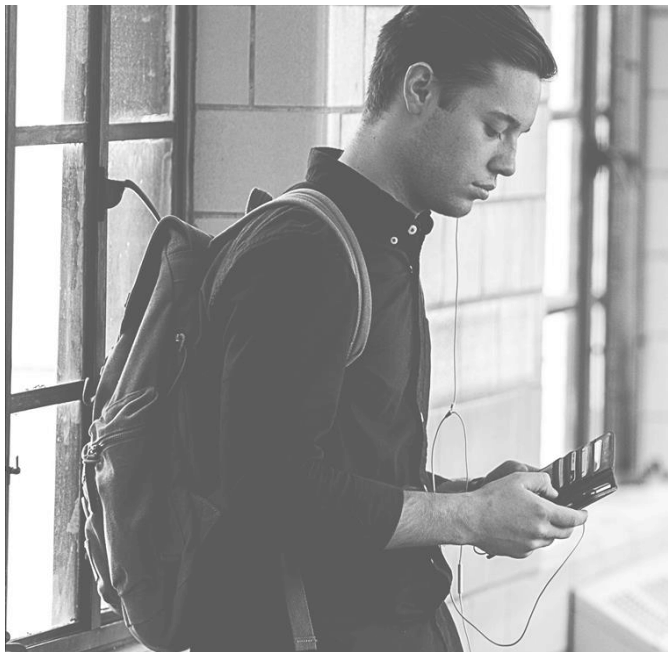
THE PATHWAYS PROGRAM

Pathways students are enrolled as students of Michigan City High School, and may participate in all social and extra-curricular activities.

Transportation is provided to Elston from MCHS each day, or students may drive to Elston. Breakfast and lunch is provided at no cost.

Each school day, Pathways students:

1. Take a class in English and/or Math. Classes are led by certified teachers with expertise in alternative education.
2. Use the online Plato Learning Environment to support academic needs in areas other than Math or English.
3. Take Career & Technical Education (CTE) classes with other CTE students.
4. Have a counselor available to address socio-emotional needs.



FOCUS: GRADUATION!

Students entering the Pathways program work with staff to design a plan that will lead to high school graduation – and to success in college, post-secondary training or a career.

Incentives are an important aspect of the program; they allow students to celebrate each milestone of the plan. Incentives are built on steps toward a goal:

- ✓ Attendance
- ✓ Mastery of subject matter
- ✓ Success on tests
- ✓ Attainment of credits
- ✓ Job attainment



THE PATHWAYS STUDENT

- Pathways serves up to 70 Michigan City High School juniors and seniors each school year.
- Most students enter the Pathways program at the beginning of the school year, however they can move into the program at any time.
- Students are selected for the program by MCHS staff, including guidance counselors, teachers, and administrators.
- Parents and students meet with Pathways staff prior to enrollment, to discuss requirements, graduation plans, and needs.
- Students may not attend the program if they have been expelled.
