Procedures or Steps

- Guided reading of the two narratives of slaves. During reading, students will mark the text where they have comments, questions, or reactions. After the reading, we will discuss as a class what they thought about the narratives.
- Close, independent reading of the two narratives of slaves. Students will read independently, again, while taking notes and highlighting. Students will then write in their journals observations, reflections, and questions that they had about the narratives. Students will then partner up and share their findings and thoughts. We will then come together as a class and discuss final thoughts.
- After preparation and mini lessons on narrative writing, students will write their own personal narrative on a significant and memorable moment/memory in their life. When students are finished writing their personal narrative, they will write a reflection in their journal which compares and contrasts their narratives with the narratives of the two slaves.
