Summer Math/Science Institute - Grade 4 - 6 Teachers

MCAS, in partnership with PNC, has created a project called "MASTERING Videos: Mathematics Applied to Science, Technology & EngineeRING Videos" for teachers in grades 4, 5 & 6. Teachers will develop problem-based learning video activities that cultivate algebra readiness and scientific reasoning skills. The goal? To foster students' curiosity by capturing everyday scenarios that raise questions, motivating them to develop a deeper understanding of math and science concepts. Teachers will receive a daily stipend AND an iPAD (must participate all 10 days) to help them create videos with their students in the classroom. Teachers must also participate in one day follow-up during the school year.
