In reflecting on 2022 there is much to celebrate! We recently received our unofficial graduation rate for the 2022 school year and I am glad to say that it improved from the previous year. I am not able to announce the actual rate, but when announced, you will see the work that has been

done by our students, staff, and the community over the last several years to improve the educational opportunities for all students.

Students will be meeting with their counselors selecting courses for the 2023-24 school year during the month of January and early February. 9th-11th grade students will be taking the Horizon middle of the year assessment the week of January 9th through the 20th. The SAT is the state accountability test and will be taken by all 11th graders in early March. We encourage all students to take the Horizon Assessment seriously.

I hope you will continue to check PowerSchool, communicate with guidance counselors and teachers, and do what is needed to ensure your student graduates College and Career Ready! 





MCHS MCJROTC COMPETE IN CYBERPATRIOT















The recent hacking of the Crown Point School District that shut down all of their schools for a day highlights the critical need for cyber security. Cadets of the Michigan City High School (MCHS) Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (MCJROTC) are practicing that highly technical skill by participating in CyberPatriot, the national cyber security competition for high school students. The cadets act as technology security managers for an organization that is defending against, and counter attacking after, a cyber attack. "The Crown Point incident is just one more piece of evidence that cyber security will contin-

ue to be a very lucrative and sought-after career field," said Senior Marine Instructor Major Tom McGrath. "This competition is whetting the appetite for these cadets to pursue a very rewarding career."

Master Sergeant Jeff Benak, the Marine Instructor, noted the expertise of the team's Faculty Advisor, Engineering and Technology teacher Ralph Gee. "Ralph's technical and tactical proficiency sets a great example for our cadets to follow."

This was the third round of the competition. It was also the qualifying round to move on to the Midwest Regional playoff. Although this might be the end of the CyberPatriot season, the cadets will remain busy with their next military drill meets at Portage on January 14th and Indianapolis Ben Davis on January 28th. They also continue to support the school and community, through events such as the One City One Sound concert and the MCHS food drive.

MCHS MCJROTC SUPPORTS MCAS AND COMMUNITY

The Michigan City High School (MCHS) Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (MCJROTC) continued to support Michigan City Area Schools (MCAS) and community events. The cadets led the Michigan City Festival of Lights parade on December 3rd, culminating by the lighting of the city Christmas tree in front of the Michigan City Library. One of the largest MCAS events of the year, the One City One Sound Christmas concert on December 8th, was supported by the cadets by helping to transform the MCHS gym into a concert hall, helping park cars of parents, friends and relatives of students from all MCAS schools performing the concert, and then helping to clean-up after the concert to enable normal operations to resume in the school gym the following day. In keeping with











the MCJROTC tradition of helping the less fortunate, the cadets worked the MCAS food drive at Ames Field on December 10th. The cadets also provided the Color Guards for the MCHS home basketball games. In recognition for her work in the community, and specifically supporting the Salvation Army, Cadet Sergeant Emily Roberts was awarded the Self Above Service award by the Salvation Army at a ceremony at their hall in Michigan City. "Unselfishness is a key leadership trait that we seek to develop in all of our cadets," said Senior Marine Instructor Major Tom McGrath. "Whether it was marching in the cold for the Festival of Lights parade, or doing parking duty for the One City One Sound concert, our cadets give willingly of themselves to support our school and community."

Master Sergeant Jeff Benak, the Marine Instructor, noted the flexibility displayed by the cadets, "The same cadets who are here at 5:45 am every day for Drill Team practice are also the ones staying to clean-up the gym at 8:30 pm after One City One Sound."

The MCHS military drill team is preparing for their next meets at Portage on Jan 14th and Indianapolis Ben Davis on Jan 28th. The Ben Davis meet is the qualifying meet for the MCJROTC National Championship being held in Washington, DC. If the Wolves qualify, the DC trip would be done at no cost to the cadets or MCHS. It, like all JROTC functions, is funded by the Marine Corps.
