
Mr. Melendez

Principles of Digital Design


In the past few weeks, we have delved into the captivating world of photography. Our students have been exploring the brief history of photography and learning how to apply digital photography techniques to Graphic Design. They have been introduced to various lighting techniques for capturing images in direct sunlight and have become acquainted with important camera settings such as aperture, ISO, and shutter speed. Through hands-on activities, our students have been actively experimenting with different settings and capturing multiple pictures to see firsthand how these choices impact the final image.

Moving forward, I am thrilled to announce that in a couple of weeks, we will be diving into the world of Photoshop. Our students will be learning the basics of this powerful editing tool and how to enhance and transform their photographs. This will undoubtedly be an exciting chapter for our class, and I am confident that our students will develop invaluable skills in photo editing.

Principles of Computing

We have been immersing ourselves in the fascinating world of computers and their impact on our society. The students have been engaged in meaningful discussions and activities to deepen their understanding of the history of computers and how they have shaped our current way of life. It has been truly inspiring to witness their curiosity and enthusiasm for this subject.

I am thrilled to announce that our students have embarked on a research project focusing on The Digital Divide in America. They are exploring how this divide has affected our own community here in Michigan City, as well as Michigan City High School. Through their research, they will be offering suggestions on how we can bridge this gap and ensure equal access to technology for all. I am confident that their findings and recommendations will shed light



on this important issue and contribute to positive change.

Computer Science 2: Cybersecurity

Cybersecurity is not an easy subject, but our students have



been working diligently to grasp its complexities. We began the school year by exploring the CIA Triad, which focuses on the concepts of Confidentiality, Integrity, and Availability. This foundation has allowed us to delve into the importance of strong passwords and how to identify and fix weak passwords. Our discussions have highlighted the potential risks of weak passwords and the ease with which hackers can gain access to personal information. To conclude Unit 1, we also introduced basic Linux Terminal commands, with plans to further explore this topic in the future.

In the next unit, we will be shifting our focus to the Human Factor and its impact on the security of devices and networks. This unit will help our students understand how human behavior can either enhance or compromise cybersecurity measures. It promises to be an engaging and eye-opening exploration for our class.

I am delighted to share some

Computer Illustration and Graphics

First and foremost, I am thrilled to inform you that our students have been learning Adobe Illustrator and how to create vector-based images. They have been mastering the basics and are now able to create simple logos using this powerful software. These skills will prove invaluable as we delve into our future projects.

I am also delighted to share that we have partnered with the city of Trail Creek for a few special projects. Our students will have the opportunity to work on and design projects specifically for the city, which will give them firsthand experience in collaborating with clients and working with tight deadlines. In addition, we will be collaborating with Legacy Sign Group, a reputable company based out of

Westville, to bring these special projects to life.

The enthusiasm and dedication our students have shown in this class have truly impressed me. I am confident that these special projects will provide them with invaluable real-world

MCJROTC

Preparing for a Busy Year

The cadets of the Michigan City High School (MCHS) Marine Corps Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (MCJROTC) have been preparing for a busy school year while still providing support for MCHS and the community. The MCJROTC provides the Color Guards for all home football games as well as parking support for the games. Among the community service events the cadets were contributors were the Dunebrook boat races for mental health and the Salvation Army Stuff-a-Bus project to obtain donations for the needy in the Michigan City area.

MCHS is starting a JROTC Raider team. The events in a raider competition are based on some of the fundamental skills required of military special operations teams. The Wolves will host their first ever Raider Meet on Oct 28th at the MCHS track. Among the events of the meet are the one rope bridge, stretcher carry, tire flip, raider agility course, and sandbag relay.

MCHS will then travel to Indianapolis Ben Davis on November 18th to compete in their Raider Meet. The goal is to compete in the National Marine Championship in Boswell, PA from April 24-25. If MCHS qualifies to compete, the trip would be completely funded by the Marine Corps.

The cadets are also preparing for the upcoming military drill

season. MCHS will host the first competition in Northwest Indiana on Nov 4th. The goal is to qualify for the MCJROTC National Meet in the Washington, DC area May 4th. The qualifying meet to make it to nationals will be on January 27th at Indianapolis Ben Davis. Similar to the Raider National Championship, if the Wolves qualify to compete in Washington, neither MCHS or the cadets would incur any expense for the trip.

A third extracurricular in which the cadets are preparing is CyberPatriot, the national high school cyber security game where cadets act as security managers for an organization's information management system. The cadets must defend against and counterattack a cyber attack.

"I think our program provides plenty of opportunities for our cadets to excel in different venues," said Senior Marine Instructor Major Tom McGrath. "We offer activities for those who are physically-inclined, technology-inclined, and those who are looking to bond with students who want to be successful in life and just haven't yet found that activity. I think that we offer that to our cadets."

Master Sergeant Jeff Benak noted the versatility and the desire to succeed in MCHS cadets. "We have cadets who are here at 5:45 am for Drill Team practice, and many of those cadets are staying after school for Raider Team practice. They really represent the dedication our students have to making MCHS a great school where students of all abilities can contribute to making our school successful."
